POETS FROM TÜRKİYE CALL FOR "GLOBAL INTIFADA" FOR PALESTINE

'Calling From Türkiye Poets Initiative' has called for a "Global Intifada" for Palestine. The Initiative seeks to appeal to global public opinion on Gaza with poets writing in various languages.

The 140 poets who signed the petition emphasize that they oppose all forms of war and that they condemn any acts of violence perpetrated against civilians, regardless of the organization, army, or force that carries them out. They also call on entire humanity to duty to put an immediate end to Israel's massacres and acts of aggression it has been carrying out on a regular basis since 1948, which has reached a peak in the ongoing massacre in Gaza.

This call by poets from Türkiye for a "Global Intifada" for Palestine has been translated into Arabic, Azerbaijani Turkish, Bosnian, Chinese, English, French, German, Greek. Hebrew, Hindi, Indonesian-Malay, Italian, Japanese, Kazakh, Korean, Kurdi-Zazaki, Latin, Persian, Russian, Spanish, Urdu, and Uyghur languages.

The petition signed by the poets is titled, "We will continue to shout that humanity dies in every person who dies."

For weeks, Israel has been launching attacks on the small piece of land, Gaza, from the air, land, and sea.
